Earlier this fall, I had the opportunity to be in **Far East Russia** to visit and encourage missionary pastors in the region through SGA’s **Reach Russia Now** initiative. While there, I heard Pastor Rostislav’s story. **I wish you could have been there!**

He told me about how your gifts and prayers through the SGA-sponsored *Antioch Initiative* have helped reach spiritually barren villages in Far East Russia—**many of which have never heard the Gospel or have had only limited exposure.**

Rostislav was once a police officer. He retired so that he could be full time in ministry. He was able to take part in the SGA-sponsored *Antioch Initiative training* (intensive Bible, ministry, and discipleship training) for leaders in order to multiply the spread

of sound churches in the vast Russian mission field. Another missionary named **Anatoly** came up to Rostislav during the classes and invited him to bring the Gospel to the villages in his region. Anatoly wanted to serve there himself, but as yet no doors had opened.

Only Five Churches in Over 100 Villages!

They began to pray together about missionary ministry. They both lived in Birobidzhan (Russia’s Jewish Autonomous Region) and had a heart for reaching **unreached villages**. They did research and found 110 villages and two cities. There are **only five churches in their region and no church in more than 100 of those villages**, and no access to the Gospel!

In fact, a woman from one village called and informed the brothers that a church had begun there

briefly 10 years ago, but now they have nothing.

Desperate Conditions Include Hunger for God

The men kept praying for these villages, and this year they began travelling to visit them with your support through SGA. And they’ve found that the conditions are terrible:

- ◆ Kids with old clothes and no shoes.
- ◆ Children who are hungry and neglected with alcoholic parents.
- ◆ A 10-year-old girl named Dasha in one town whose mom was living with her fourth husband.

They started helping Dasha with homework, food and Bible teaching. Through this, the parents

finally came to meet them last month. **Then last Sunday, the parents allowed Dasha to take the bus**

With only six people now gathering together, a foundational group is forming. Very slowly, people are drawn from darkness to the light of hope. **With the help of SGA partners, these men are going to dark, lost villages with the light of the Gospel.**

Their goal—110 villages with the light of Christ shining in the darkness. Through your support of these pastors and SGA’s *Reach Russia Now* initiative, you are right there with them! ♦

I am so thankful for the ladies in the prison ministry team from the church—and for those who helped their ministry through SGA. If that is you, here is how you helped me find eternal freedom:

I was raised by my grandmother and great grandmother. My parents lived apart. When I was in the third grade, both of my grandmothers died within the same year. At first my father took me to live with him, but he had his own different family at the time.

So at age 16, I met a man and was living with him. Soon, narcotics became part of his life. Even the birth of his son did not stop him. When our baby was a year and a half old, I ran away to live with my mother.

I enrolled in school, worked, and met another man. I thought that here at last was the one I had

been looking for! We got married and he adopted my son, then I got pregnant and gave birth to another child. We lived well for a time and all of my friends envied us. Eventually I enrolled in another school and opened a small business.

Then narcotics tore my life apart again. My husband began using. He challenged me to try them. I became addicted! My life went downhill completely.

For a while, I wound up in terrible shape at a tuberculosis hospital. My husband ended up in prison. We divorced and I ended up in prison for more than five years.

But years before, some friends began visiting me and telling me how they had been to Christian rehab and how faith in Jesus Christ was powerful! That is when the women from the local church [supported by SGA] began to talk to me in the church. I came to know Jesus in the prison and began reading the Bible. The first days after my

release, I began attending the church. My life finally gained meaning and a goal. The Lord used prison to bring me to my true salvation in Him! ♦

WAR ZONE: Providing God's Love to Shattered Children

I send you warm greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

In July, we had the opportunity to go into the war zone in eastern Ukraine and hold a camp for local children. These children have been through heavy shelling, living in basements for shelter, and facing hunger. **Relatives of some of the children have been either killed or injured. Every family we met has suffered the consequences of the terrible**

war. It was hard for us to listen to some of the stories the children and their parents told us. Yet we are happy and thankful that we were able to serve these

children while we could. **For five days, we played various games, made crafts, had Bible lessons, and treats.** In total, we reached about 70-80 children. Please pray that many will trust in Christ as their Savior!

In addition to children's ministry, my wife Lyuda is engaged in **women's ministry.** She holds meetings in a local café, and the ladies share their stories and make crafts. There are 60 women who attend, and of that number, only 20 are believers. While the women are meeting, I hold a meeting with brothers in another café, where we discuss development of men's ministry in our region. Please pray for much fruit to result!

The Lord has blessed us in building a new House of Prayer. We had 13 brothers perform the work beginning in March when the walls were put up in four days. Then in the summer, they put on the roof, windows and doors in 10 days. In two weeks, they had built us a House of Prayer and donated their time and labor!

I thank you very much for the opportunities you help give me to serve, and to help others while preaching the Gospel. We love you! ♦

CIS IN THE NEWS

World Health Organization: Russian Alcohol Consumption Drops Sharply

A report released earlier this year by the World Health Organization claims that alcohol consumption has dropped in Russia by 40 percent since 2003. The UN-affiliated body attributes the decrease to a series of measures brought in under President Vladimir Putin, who doesn't drink liquor and advocates a healthy lifestyle. This trend is a



factor in increased life expectancies in Russia—78 years for women and 68 for men, which is an historic peak.

This is encouraging news given the way that alcohol consumption exploded after the fall of communism and the end of the Soviet Union. **Evangelical churches have also played an important part with successful Bible-based drug and alcohol rehabilitation ministries, several of which are supported by SGA partners.** Please keep praying with us for more opportunities to share the life-changing Gospel in Russia, and point the way to God's delivering power. ♦
