# The River is the Only Road!

## *Your Gifts Help Reach Remote Siberian Villages with the Gospel*

**B**efore we started on this missionary trip to unreached towns and villages, we had to prepare for about five months. We purchased **boats, motors, food, and life jackets**. A team was formed and we began planning our journey realizing the challenges that lay ahead. There is **no signal communication for mobile phones, no roads, and no medical care**. **This is swampy, forested land with bears, mosquitoes and gnats**. If your boat breaks down or sinks, there is no one to help you, and the river has shallow places that can break the boat motor.

We thought about how to reach these people along the river, and we decided as a church to purchase groceries for them including canned meat, cereals, flour, etc. We especially wanted to help needy, large families. The journey started on July 6 with three boats—two carrying our team and the third carrying our cargo. We had planned on the

village of Orefievo, but we overlooked it on the river and went on for two hours. We almost ran out of fuel. Two fishermen told us we had passed Orefievo long ago

and that we were headed for Stariye Birilyusy. We prayed and decided that if God brought us to this village instead of our original destination, it meant He had prepared something there for us.

On our arrival in Birilyusy, we walked around the town and prayed that God would lead us to those who desire to hear the Gospel and truth. We came to a house where we met a man named Zhenya. We talked with him and offered him groceries, which he refused. But when he saw a Bible, he grabbed it from us and exclaimed, “That’s what I need!” **We told him of salvation and Christ’s love. He was so moved that he offered us his tractor as transportation so we could ride around the community and tell people about Christ!** We visited several poor families and gave out food packages, sharing about the Lord along the way. The people were surprised that someone cared about them. We told them that God cares about them, and it was for them that God gave His Son. They thanked us for the hope we brought to these forgotten villages and towns.

On this trip, we covered 60 miles by water. We are so thankful for all who prayed for us and helped make our journey possible. This is our joint mission, our joint labor, and you have a significant part in the work of salvation of human souls. Thank you all! ♦

# Camp Little Pearl in Belarus:

## *Your Gifts Help Provide Sick Children with Physical and Spiritual Care in a Pandemic!*

**D**uring these challenging days, the Lord has given us the opportunity to serve Him and minister to the children of our country through the **Little Pearl Diagnostic Camp**. The 135 children who came in the first session in July had already been quarantined in their homes because of the COVID-19 pandemic. These special days—made possible with your prayers and support—gave these children ten memorable days in the open air—a **loving island of summer joy, happiness, care, and the hope of the Gospel!**

Some of the children needed special care as the pandemic claimed the lives of their fathers. The demand for camp vouchers was greater than the number of children we could accommodate. Maximum safety protocols were observed to prevent the spread

of infection. All staff members passed the COVID-19 tests in advance and were required to reside in the campgrounds during the sessions. Children were assigned to small squads, and the majority of the activities were held out in the open air. Even with these conditions, the children were full of joy and their parents were understanding—and even supporting us in solving various issues.

Each day began with prayer in the children's respective squads. In addition to the games and activities, the lessons focused on helping the children make the right choices in life. Every day, they will have to make choices in domestic situations, routine matters, and especially eternity. **In the Bible classes, we spoke of how choices should be guided by the Word of God—using Bible heroes and the choices they made in different situations.** We also did creative activities, cooking, fishing, and spent time allowing for quiet conversations around the campfire, and then evening devotions. The time when the young people decide on devoting their lives to the Lord is the most precious thing—this is the goal that makes all our labors worth it all!

We thank the Lord for this opportunity and for His protection, and for you—our brothers and sisters who prayed for us and supported our camp ministry. ♦

This difficult time has prompted many people to turn to the Lord in repentance, and it is very joyful! We had been praying for some for 20 years, and they finally repented and asked to be baptized. I

They are inviting us to their homes. Our church members have become closer and more united, are more diligent in reading the Bible and in prayer. There are new people—even unbelievers—who want to join our study group “Bible for the Year.”

am getting many phone calls from people asking questions about spiritual topics. Some are afraid of vaccinations, others are worried about being chipped.

Thus far, we know of no infected people in our village, and we praise God for that. We have been observing a quarantine regime and no meetings are taking place in the church building. **Despite that, we have held the Lord’s Supper in homes, and youth are gathering to play soccer in the open air next to our home.** Many new teenagers have joined our youth

sports ministry, and it’s a delight! We have taken children out to the forest and the lake, or to the river where we all pray. We use the internet to share messages from Kazakh Union of Evangelical Christian-Baptist (UECB) president Franz Tissen, and several have repented through this outreach. In our courtyard, we have been gathering outside for Bible reading and tea in the mornings, and we always have a lot of guests. People have become hungry for God’s Word. They ask questions and take literature with greater desire. Glory to Jesus!

An unexpected toothache led to an opportunity to share. I went to a dentist in a nearby town, and he willingly accepted the Bible in the Kazakh language. Over the course of a month, I visited villages and preached the Gospel, even meeting with Kazakh teachers and giving them Bibles. People need to hear the Word of God, and they are frightened by this “new world order.”

**The coronavirus pandemic has shaken everyone up, yet this is having good fruit for eternity.** We are seeing many people seek shelter in the Lord Jesus. Praise be to Him! ♦

## CIS IN THE NEWS

### PRAY: Belarus Roiled by Protests in Wake of Election

Massive political protests involving thousands of people broke out across Belarus in the aftermath of the country's presidential election August 9. While the official results showed President Alexander Lukashenko winning with 80 percent of the vote, the supporters of opposition candidate Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya said that the results were falsified. The protests and demands for Mr. Lukashenko to step down began to spread across the country, even after authorities launched a severe crackdown. The European Union and the U.S. government issued statements of concern, while Russia issued a warning to other countries not to interfere in Belarus' affairs.

Evangelical church leaders in Belarus told us, *"We do not participate in any political affairs. We only pray that God will save us from war, and that His holy will would be accomplished. We continue fellowship and worship while continuing our ministry."* This is in keeping with how the faithful churches conducted themselves during the communist years, and the Lord sustained them—sowing the seeds for a later abundant harvest when comparative freedom came. Please continue to intercede in prayer for the country, and for our brothers and sisters as they proclaim peace and reconciliation in Christ. ♦
